

**LA Mission College Accreditation Evaluation Team

Team Chair, Deborah J. Ikeda, Clovis Community College President

Ms. Ikeda started work as a counselor for Loop City College, one of the Chicago City Colleges, in 1977 and eventually became an Assistant Dean of Academic Support Services there before becoming the Associate Dean of Students, Counseling and Guidance at Fresno City College in 1981. She became the Vice President of Instruction and Student Services for the State Center Community College District North Centers in 2005, where she led the accreditation effort to start a new college, Clovis Community College. Ms. Ikeda was appointed President of Clovis Community College in 2012. Ms. Ikeda served on the California Community College Board of Chief Instructional Officers. She has served on the California Community College Chancellor's Office Advisory Committee for Matriculation, Basic Skills and the Counseling Advisory Committee. She has been on over 15 ACCJC team visits as well as leading team visits to various colleges.

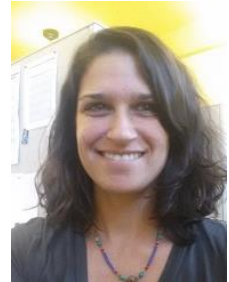
Kristina Allende, Mt. San Antonio College Professor of English
