

Art 501 Beginning Two Dimensional Design, 3 Units : Ruppel

Course description: A foundation course in design. Students apply the elements and principles of design utilizing the techniques of traditional art media. Emphasis is placed on compositional attributes, including the relationship between visual perception and communication. Emphasis is placed on applying design principles to projects .

Student learning outcome: **OFFICIAL-RRT- Apply historical concepts of the elements and principles of design utilizing the techniques of traditional art media.**

Goals of the course:

(unapproved and not officially recognized by the administration of mission college as goals of the course)

Students will demonstrate the ability to solve problems by utilizing the principles of design.

Students will demonstrate visual literacy based on objective rather than subjective opinion. Evidence will be written or oral communications that articulate an objective rather than personal response to works of art, be able to explain how personal opinion (subjective) inhibits literacy and that quantifiable formal factors shape their response. (cognition vs. intuition)

Attendance:Students are expected to attend every meeting of all classes for which he or she is registered. A student absent from classes for emergency reasons must inform the instructor of the reason for the absence. Whenever absences “in hours” exceeds the number of hours the class meets per week, the student may be excluded from the class by the instructor. Students who have pre-registered for a class and who do not attend the first meeting of the class may forfeit their right to a place in the class. It is the student's responsibility to officially drop any class he/ she does not continue to attend.

Cheating and Plagiarism:The instructor reserves the right to determine if cheating or plagiarism has occurred; if it does the student will received a “F” on the assignment or exam, and may receive a “F” for the course

Objective opinion-universal-the attempt to be without bias or prejudice, a condition perceptible to others

Subjective opinion—personal-within the individuals mind and incapable of being checked externally or verified by others.

Intent-the goal of the artist, what he/she wants to communicate/express **Content**-what it contains, what it communicates to the viewer.
