## STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. Explain the methods astronomers use to explore the natural phenomena of the universe, including observation, hypothesis development, and evaluation of evidence.
2. Demonstrate a working knowledge of the historical development of key astronomical concepts such as the ever-unfolding discovery of our place in the universe, including the latest developments in planetology and cosmology.
3. Identify and evaluate the causes and possible solutions to problems of environmental concern such as global warming, resource conservation and pollution.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Addresses such questions as:  
What is our place in the universe?  
What kinds of things occupy the universe?  
What am I actually seeing when I look up at the sky (moon, planets, stars, etc)?  
What is it like on other planets?  
Where did the universe come from? Where is it going?  
Is there life elsewhere in the universe?  
How do we know what we know?
