Course Description and Objectives: This course offers an introduction to basic grammar as it relates to writing and other communication skills. It covers parts of speech, sentence structure, types of phrases and clauses, verb tenses and agreement, noun possessives and plurals, pronoun usage, comparison, capitalization, punctuation, and other related topics.

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course, a student will be able to label simple and advanced sentence patterns, employ standard rules of pluralization and possession, choose and spell verb tenses correctly, apply principles of pronoun agreement, construct sentences with correct subject/verb agreement, and combine simple sentences into correctly punctuated compound and complex sentences.
