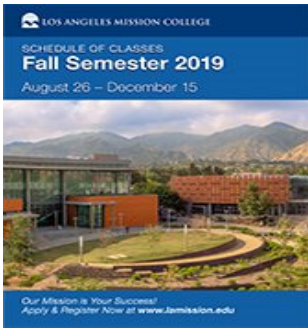

Lecture Notes and Canvas: All your resources such as class lecture handouts are located in “**modules**” and you can use these handouts to take notes and to study for quizzes.

1. Participation Activities/Misc. Assignments (50 pts): Regular and punctual attendance is expected from all of us. Unlike most classes, missing one class will place you at a disadvantage since we will be conducting in class learning activities for credit. It’s expected that you participate in building a community of support, encouragement, accountability and have fun learning with your classmates. **Attendance:** students who miss more than 3 classes may be withdrawn from the class.

2. Reading Textbook- It is expected that students read the chapters in the textbook on a weekly basis. We will cover the content in this order. **Chapters 1-5, 16, 7,9,11-14, 19, 21**

3. Quizzes: (approx.200 points) Chapter quizzes will be conducted online inside Canvas, after we cover the content in class and due usually on Sundays before midnight. Chapter quizzes will be based on lecture and textbook content covered in class. The final exam will be conducted in class using a scantron form. A final review guide will be provided ahead of time.

4. Essay Papers/Assignments: (100) Any essay will need proper college writing standards such as grammar, punctuation, capitals, spelling. All instructions can be found in Canvas. All essays that are turned in will be verified through VeriCite, inside our Canvas app **FREE WRITING HELP:** Use NetTutor app in Canvas to receive help with your essays before due date or visit LRC Writing Lab for in-person assistance. <https://youtu.be/Vq6J84Sv2ro>
