1. Assess and describe the three sociological theories and how they impact sociological research.
2. Utilize a research design to complete social research and analyze the data to come to a sociological conclusion.
3. Define a social problem you have experienced and discuss solutions to reduce, educate or eliminate such problems in society.

How to complete this class successfully?

- 1. Lecture Handouts:** Purchase lecture handouts packet for the semester at bookstore for \$3 and bring to each class.
 - 2. Participation Activities/Misc. Assignments (100 pts):** Regular and punctual attendance is expected from all of us. Missing one class will place you at a disadvantage since there will be in class learning activities for credit. It’s expected that you participate in building a community of support, encouragement, accountability and have fun learning with your classmates.
 - 3. Reading Textbook-** It is expected that students read the chapters in the textbook on a weekly basis. We will cover the content in this order. **Chapters 1-5, 16, 7,9,11-14, 19, 21**
 - 4. Chapter Quiz: (220 points)** Chapter quizzes will be conducted online inside Canvas, after we cover the content in class and due usually on Fridays or Sundays by 11:59 pm. **Chapter quizzes will be based on lecture and textbook content covered in class.** Students will not be able to review which question they got right or wrong, they will simply see final scores. The final exam will be conducted in class using a scantron form. A final review guide will be provided.
 - 5. Essay Papers/Assignments: (65)** Any essay will need proper college writing standards such as grammar, punctuation, capitals, spelling. All instructions can be found in Canvas. All essays will be verified through VeriCite, inside our Canvas app. For FREE WRITING HELP, visit LRC Writing Lab for in-person assistance.
- Extra credit-** You can ONLY earn up to 20 points of extra credit by last lecture of the semester. See Canvas in “Extra Credit” modules.

Associate in Arts in Sociology for Transfer The Associate in Arts Degree for Sociology for Transfer is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in a similar major at a CSU campus. Students completing this degree are **guaranteed admission to the CSU system** (not to a particular campus or major) and receive **priority in registration** as a junior. This degree will provide the student with a strong foundation in the discipline, as well as exposure to various areas included in this field. Students interested in transferring and/or completing an Associate in Arts in Sociology for Transfer **should meet with a counselor** to determine the coursework necessary to complete all the requirements.

To complete the degree, students must

1) Complete 60 CSU transferable semester units and (2) have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0.
