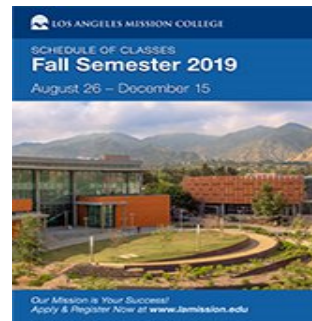

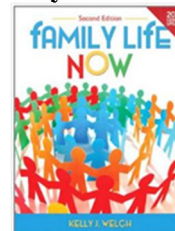

**Student Learning Outcomes** (by the end of this course you will):

1. Evaluate social variables that increase success in personal relationships according to sociological research.
2. Identify various parenting styles and analyze the impact such method had on student's childhood.
3. Conduct sociological research by using a research method to identify themes or cycles that continue in families and determine solutions for the next generation.

**1. Participation Activities/Misc. Assignments (50 pts):** Regular and punctual attendance is expected from all of us.
