

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this class, a student will be able to

1. Assess and describe the three sociological theories and how they impact sociological research.
2. Utilize research design and complete social research, analyze the data to come to a Sociological conclusion.
3. Define a social problem you have experienced and discuss solutions to reduce, educate or eliminate such problems in society.

Instructor/Student Participation: Please email me in CANVAS under "**INBOX**"  for a prompt reply within 24 hours or sooner Mon-Fri. I prefer to be addressed as "**Prof Levy**" not just Levy. In order for a student to be considered an "active" student, you must be logging into the website at least 3 times a week, responding to "INBOX" messages and **successfully** completing assignments. Please expect frequent communication and feedback from me via your "INBOX" and "Announcements" that are emailed directly to the email address you selected in Ass#1. I typically return grades within 7 days of an assignment closing or sooner. You will receive a notification that I've "**unmuted**" that assignment, therefore you can click on "GRADES" to read the private feedback and a completed rubric. Your peers will also be writing to you in "Discussion Forums" therefore be sure to participate with them as well. Students who do not meet participation standards may be dropped.

Assignments: (75) pts All your assignments are organized in "**Modules**," so it's recommended that you click on "START HERE" then "**PART ONE**", then use the bottom arrow to see each file that is there to assist you. Avoid **just** using your TO DO list, as you will miss helpful information. Read all the directions, they are short and precise. Most assignments are already open and set up for you to be moving as fast as you want to.

Textbook Readings: It's highly recommended that when reading your textbook, you make notes as you read. Then take your chapter Quiz as soon as you can after reading it. Use the **Chapter Review Guides** located in each chapter quiz for topics to specifically focus on. Skimming chapters is not recommended to students who want to be successful in this class. Be careful to **read in the order** listed below, as we do skip some chapters.

Estimated STUDY Time: 6 hours of reading textbook per week, 2-3 hours of studying and completing other assignments. Remember most assignments are opened **ahead of time** to be completed BEFORE the deadline. Late work will **NOT** be accepted. Any scheduling problems can cause you to get behind, so complete assignments **EARLY**. **Reading Chapter Order:** 1-3,5,7,16, 9, 11-12, 14 ,8,13, 19, 21 (Ch.4 extra credit)

Chapter Quizzes-located in each weekly module (14 chapters=280 points) You will need to complete a 20 multiple choice or T/F questions for each chapter quiz assigned. You will be able to utilize notes and the book during these quizzes, but you will be restricted to **one question at a time and 20 minute deadline**. So be prepared when you **BEGIN** the quiz. There will be **no quiz reset** or time extensions, so use a reliable internet connection and do not use a SMART phone for your quizzes. Please review your answers closely prior to clicking on "Next". Take the time to read the chapters, as the questions are not just looking up definitions, you must understand concepts too. **You will NOT be able to review your answers after the test is complete**. This class does not give the student the ability to check which questions they got right or wrong. However, you can ask me any questions and I will respond after the quiz deadline has passed.

ESSAY WRITING: (90 points) You are required to complete some essay by attaching your document or typing in a text box. Some of these file uploads will be submitted to the VeriCite app that exists within Canvas to verify that your work is plagiarism free. **Vericite does not accept Apple .pages files**. You are able to read the instructions and go back to into the assignment. There is no time limit to read or work in the assignment, but you must submit the work by the deadline. All writing in this course must adhere to college level punctuation, grammar and spelling standards. **Discussion Forums (DF)** require you to post your response to the questions first, then you will be able to see and respond to another student's post. Anything written in these forums is public, so please avoid discussing private or confidential information. "DF" are worth **10 points**. **VERICITE instructions** **FREE WRITING HELP:** Use NetTutor app in Canvas to receive help in proofing your essays before due dates. 

Los Angeles Mission College Degree: Associate in Arts in Sociology for Transfer

The Associate in Arts Degree for Sociology for Transfer is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in a similar major at a CSU campus. Students completing this degree are **guaranteed admission to the CSU system** (not to a particular campus or major) and receive **priority in registration** as a junior. This degree will provide the student with a strong foundation in the discipline, as well as exposure to various areas included in this field. Students interested in transferring and/or completing an Associate in Arts in Sociology for Transfer **should meet with a counselor** to determine the coursework necessary to complete all the requirements.

To complete the degree, students must

1) Complete 60 CSU transferable semester units and (2) have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0.
