COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:

3B COLLEGE ESL III: READING/VOCABULARY

Prerequisite: ESL 2 with "C" or appropriate placement score. | Lecture: 3 hours. 3 UNITS. Builds reading and vocabulary skills through the reading of passages on a wide variety of interesting topics. Note: Student must take 3B + 3C together. Pass/No Pass Course – Not Letter Grade.

3C COLLEGE ESL III: LISTENING/SPEAKING

Prerequisite: ESL 2 with "C" or appropriate placement score. | Lecture: 3 hours. 3 UNITS. Builds oral and listening comprehension skills, as well as the learning of new conversational forms. Note: Student must take 3B + 3C together. Pass/No Pass Course – Not Letter Grade.

<u>IMPORTANT NOTES:</u> The deadline to drop without a "W" is on <u>February 18.</u> If you have to drop this course, you must drop before the deadline without a grade of "W." You must drop both ESL 3B and ESL 3C. If you drop after the deadline, you will receive a "W" on your transcript.

Effective July 1, 2012, students will only have 3 attempts to pass a class. If a student gets a "W" or grade of "D," "F," "I," or "NP" in class, that will count as an attempt. A student's past record of course attempts district wide will also be considered; therefore, before the end of week 2 or 02/18, you should carefully consider if you can reasonable manage this course with the other factors in your life (e.g. work, family, course load). If you think you will not be able to complete this course with a passing grade, please drop by Saturday, February 18.

If you are absent three or more times by May 3rd, you will be <u>automatically</u> dropped in both these ESL 3B and ESL 3C sections. ATTENDANCE IS CRUCIAL IN THIS COURSE.

The last day to do a section transfer is March 8. Please notify me and the instructor of the section(s) that you are transferring to. Your grade will be affected if you do not do so.

- Final Exam with Reading/Writing (20%)

<u>Attendance and Homework:</u> Regular attendance and class participation are absolutely essential. Please notify me if you are unable to attend class. Students who are absent four or more times will not pass the course. Students who missed three sessions by May 3 will be automatically DROPPED or WITHRAWN from the class (ESL 3B and 3C).

Every three late in class will count as an absent. Three times late equals one absent, six times late equals two absences, and so forth. Being absent and/or late will highly affect your grade.

Homework is due in the beginning of the class. Be sure to put your name and date on your homework. Please do not do your homework during class. If you are absent, it is your responsibility to find out and make up any work that you missed, and do homework. Please call another student to find out what you missed and homework that are due. I do not give make up exam or quiz if a student is absent on the day of the exam/quiz.
