CATALOG COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course covers the community college transfer process including college/university selection, admission, and application procedures for public and private institutions of higher education. Research utilizing the internet will be included.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

1. Student will be able to understand the history of private and public higher education with specific reference to California's Higher Education Master Plan.
2. Student will be able to distinguish between departmental certificates, A.A/A.S. Degrees.
3. Student will develop an understanding of major and general education requirements at the California State University System (CSU GE) as well as the University of California Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)
4. Student will examine the university application process and completion of a personal statement.
5. Student will understand the transfer requirements for a community college athlete transferring to a Division I, II, III or NAIA institution.

STUDENT LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

1. Student will be able to define transfer requirements to four-year colleges/universities.
2. Students will be able to differentiate between UC, CSU, and private general education checklist.
3. Students will be able to differentiate between Associate degrees and certificates.
4. Students will compare and contrast a UC, a CSU, and a private school in terms of transfer requirements and campus profiles.
5. Student will explore the Internet, visit campuses, and create an educational plan that will meet the requirements for transfer to the desired major and schools.
