3)	Class participation and attendance	(25 %)

I reserve the right to alter the number of assignments as may be necessary.

Finals: Our final will be on Thursday, December 12, 8:00 - 10:00 pm. A creative project or presentation may be substituted for the 4-5 page paper mentioned above, but you must first meet with me so that I may approve your substitution. (Don't worry, I will go over the midterm and final before it is due.)
