Emphasizes the physical principles essential to fundamental understanding f astronomy. Discusses historical foundations, the tools of the astronomer, the solar system, stars and stellar evolution, galaxies and deep space, cosmology, and extraterrestrial life. **PAY CLASS**

Explores the concepts of algebra, including signed numbers, exponents, linear equations, graphs, and quadratic equations. It also contains techniques for interpreting and solving verbal programs related to the above topics.
