

Accomplishments of Los Angeles Mission College 2011 to 2015

Background

The purpose of this report is to briefly describe the major accomplishments of Los Angeles Mission College (LAMC) over the last four years. This is being done to remind students, faculty, staff and community members the significant accomplishments of LAMC in order to celebrate the positive contributions the college has made to education and the residents it serves.

1. Ten (10) Associate Degree Transfer programs approved that will guarantee admissions to the California State Universities
2. Reaffirmation of Accreditation from ACCJC in 2014 after resolving 14 recommendations
3. Two student trustees from Mission over the last three years that served as elected Student Trustees on LACCD's Board of Trustees
4. Three buildings voted by the Design Build Institute of America as the most sustainable education buildings in the USA
5. 5% percent enrollment growth in AY 13-14 and 6.4% in AY 14-15
6. Fiscal solvency over these years
7. College base budget growth from \$26M to \$35M
8. Grants totaling \$10M from federal, state and foundation sources above the base budget
9. LAMC transfer students graduating from UCLA, Stanford and USC at record numbers
10. LAMC is the model for re-entry students recognized by the Ford Foundation and the State Chancellor's Office
11. Establishment of the Veterans Resource Center
12. Over 20 faculty and staff trained as certified federal mediators under the Department of Labor's Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service
13. STEM program enrollment increased from 100 to 500 students
14. Los Angeles County Office of Education and DPSS expanded contract education for drop out students from 100 to 300
15. FT tenure track counselors increased from 9 to 18
16. Fifteen new tenure track faculty hired
17. Establishment of the Cinematography/Film program curriculum
18. Establishment of the Computer Science in Engineering Program
19. Expansion of concurrent enrollment for high school students from 200 to 400 students and expected increases to 1000 over the next two years
20. Establishment of the School Medicaid Allotment Allocation (SMAA) program that will bring federal reimbursements to the nine colleges with LAMC receiving an 8% administrative fee to manage the program. This will bring \$1M to LAMC annually beginning FY 16-17.

21. There has been 100% increased access to computers on campus with new computers installed
22. The college will launch a Certified Nursing Assistant Program in the Fall of 2015 that will provide jobs to students in the home health care industry
23. LAMC has maintained the lowest crime statistics of the nine colleges in LACCD
24. LAMC established the L.A. Sheriff Explorer program which is the only program available in the nine LACCD colleges
25. The Athletic Program has produced two conference baseball champions and an All American Soccer player named by the U.S. Soccer Association. Athletes are going to four year universities with scholarships in record numbers.
26. LAMC has established a full service health clinic on campus complete with state of the art health services equipment and provides comprehensive mental health services
27. LAMC expanded its book rental program to lower the cost of textbook purchases
28. The College has established the Media Arts Workforce Program with Warner Bros. Television.
