Topics include summarizing data; descriptive statistics; correlation and linear regression; probability; discrete distributions; continuous distributions; statistical reasoning skills and interpretation of calculation results. The use of technology is integrated into the course to perform statistical analysis and the relevance of the statistical findings is interpreted. This class can be taken in conjunction with credit class or as a stand-alone introduction to basic statistics.

Topics include sampling distributions; estimation and confidence intervals; hypothesis testing by choosing the appropriate distribution and inference; analysis of variance (ANOVA), chi-square and t-tests; statistical reasoning skills and interpretation of calculation results. The use of technology is integrated into the course to perform statistical analysis and the relevance of the statistical findings is interpreted.
